In 2014, Flint, Michigan experienced the distress and illness caused by the city which switched its drinking water from Detroit to the Flint River to be a cost-saving measure. The water was contaminated with lead. An article I read said that “inadequate treatment and testing of the water resulted in a series of major water quality and health issues for Flint residents. Those issues were chronically ignored, overlooked, and discounted by government officials even as complaints mounted that the foul-smelling, discolored, and off-tasting water piped into Flint homes for eighteen months was causing skin rashes, hair loss, and itchy skin” (Natural Resources Defense Council, 2018).

Rick Snyder (former Michigan governor) “is accused of ignoring, denying or covering up problems that left thousands of children exposed to toxic lead in their drinking water for about 18 months. Flint, a community of 100,000 people, largely poor and minority, unable to drink from their taps because of the toxic water, is one of the biggest environmental justice disasters known in this country” (Washington Post, 2016).

I am going to change this food and water inequality by making money and giving it to the people who need it. I am going to make money by doing YouTube. “A YouTube channel can receive up to \$18 per 1000 ad views” (Influencer MarketingHub). This means that for every 1000 video views, the channel will receive somewhere between \$3 and \$5” (ViewsReviews, 2021).
